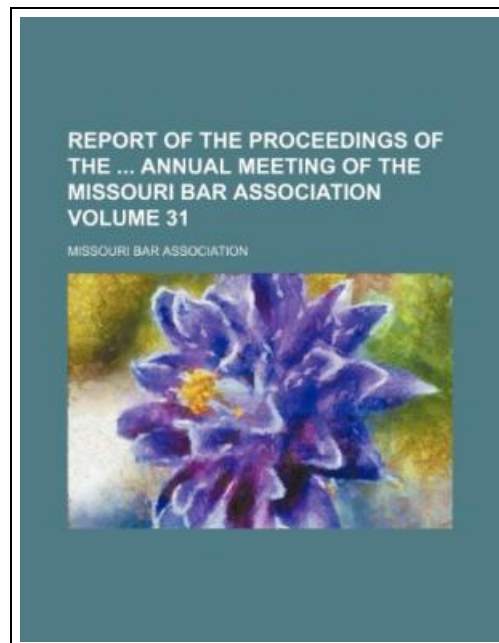

He excelled among his playmates both on the playgrounds and in the school room. His reputation as a daring and skillful horseback rider still survives, and he was, perhaps, the best baseball player of the village and has all his life been a keen lover of this sport. He finished the Lamar public schools and later attended the Indiana State University one year. He was chosen principal of the Lamar public schools when he was only twenty years of age--being the youngest of the corps of teachers--in which capacity he was remarkably successful. On March 27, 1873, he was married to Miss Kate Fast and three children of this union survive him, namely, Harry W. Timmonds, a law yer in the active practice at Lamar, Missouri; Mrs. Paul Du Val, of Chicago, and Mrs. Shane Ross, of Kansas City, Missouri. From 1873 to 1880 he edited and published The Stockton Journal, at Stockton, Missouri, and earned for himself the reputation of a clear, forceful writer. During this time he studied law and in this way prepared himself for his chosen profession. He was admitted to the bar in 1880, when he returned from Stockton to his old home at Lamar, and at once entered upon an active, successful and lucrative practice.
