Of these there is little to be recorded beyond the fact that one body had been buried in a sitting posture, and above the head, and resting directly upon it, was the carapace of a large turtle. All the other burials were at full length, and not, as is so commonly stated, with reference to the points of the compass. The one object had was that of placing the body out of sight. Careful examinations of exten sive burial places along our larger rivers, and upon the islands, however, show that greater ceremony was common at times of interment objects of value were usually placed with the dead, and the earth heaped up to form little mounds.
