By focusing on the Oriya situation the study basically highlights two major forms of conflict-----regional nationalism and regionalism in multicultural and/or multinational countries such as India. To differentiate these two forms of conflict the study, as a point of departure, makes a distinction between political nationalism and cultural nationalism.
